Goals

Participant Guidelines

- On the Zoom toolbar below, use the “*Raise Hand*” feature under “*Participants*” when you want to speak, and be sure to “*Un-mute*” when called upon.
- You will normally be called on in the order in which hands were raised, unless the Moderator or Instructor wants to give preference to someone who has not yet spoken.
- Try to distill your ideas and limit your comments to no more than about three minutes each time you speak.
- Please cite the source(s) of your information when expressing your point of view, particularly on controversial topics.
- Listen carefully to others and try to understand the position of those who may disagree with you.
- Humor and a pleasant manner go far in making a point.
- Use the “*Chat*” feature in the Toolbar for an additional way to reach out to be heard.
